
HST Diamond Quilt Pattern

Finished Size: 96" × 96" (This May Vary-See Note under Assemble Quilt)

Skill Level: Beginner Friendly **WOF** = width of fabric

Use 1/4" seam allowance.

Fabric Requirements & Cutting Instructions

Colour	Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
	A	5/8 yard	Cut 2 strips: 10 ½ x WOF Sub-cut into 8 squares: 10 ½ x 10 ½
	В	1⅓ yards	Cut 4 strips: $10 \frac{1}{2} \times WOF$ Sub-cut into 14 squares: $10 \frac{1}{2} \times 10 \frac{1}{2}$
	С	1 % yards	Cut 5 strips: $10 \frac{1}{2} \times WOF$ Sub-cut into 18 squares: $10 \frac{1}{2} \times 10 \frac{1}{2}$
	D	% yard	Cut 3 strips: 10 ½ x WOF Sub-cut into 10 squares: 10 ½ x 10 ½
	E	1 ¾ yards	Cut 6 strips: 10 ½ x WOF Sub-cut into 24 squares: 10 ½ x 10 ½
	F	2 yards	Cut 7 strips: 10 ½ x WOF Sub-cut into 26 squares: 10 ½ x 10 ½

BLOCK ONE - 8 HST's

USE:

- 4 squares of FABRIC A
- 4 squares of FABRIC F
- 1. Place one square of FABRIC A and one square of FABRIC F right sides together.



- 2. Draw a diagonal line across one square and sew a quarter inch on either side of the line.
- 3. Cut along the line. This will yield two half square triangles.
- 4. Press towards the darker fabric.

Repeat with remaining pieces for a total of 8 HST's.

BLOCK TWO - 8 HST's

USE:

- 4 squares of FABRIC A
- 4 squares of FABRIC E
- 1. Place one square of FABRIC A and one square of FABRIC E right sides together.



- 2. Draw a diagonal line across one square and sew a quarter inch on either side of the line.
- 3. Cut along the line. This will yield two half square triangles.
- 4. Press towards the darker fabric.

Repeat with remaining pieces. This will yield 8 HST's.

BLOCK THREE - 12 HST's

USE:

- 6 squares of FABRIC B
- 6 squares of FABRIC F
- 1. Place one square of FABRIC B and one square of FABRIC F right sides together.



- 2. Draw a diagonal line across one square and sew a quarter inch on either side of the line.
- 3. Cut along the line. This will yield two half square triangles.
- 4. Press towards the darker fabric.

Repeat with remaining pieces. This will yield 12 HST's.

BLOCK FOUR - 16 HST's

USE:

- 8 squares of FABRIC B
- 8 squares of FABRIC E
- 1. Place one square of FABRIC B and one square of FABRIC E right sides together.



- 2. Draw a diagonal line across one square and sew a quarter inch on either side of the line.
- 3. Cut along the line. This will give you two half square triangles.
- 4. Press towards the darker fabric.

Repeat with remaining pieces. This will yield 16 HST's.

BLOCK FIVE - 20 HST's

USE:

- 10 squares of FABRIC C
- 10 squares of FABRIC F



- 1. Place one square of FABRIC C and one square of FABRIC F right sides together.
- 2. Draw a diagonal line across one square and sew a quarter inch on either side of the line.
- 3. Cut along the line. This will yield two half square triangles.
- 4. Press towards the darker fabric.

Repeat with remaining pieces. This will yield 20 HST's.

BLOCK SIX - 16HST's

USE:

- 8 squares of FABRIC C
- 8 squares of FABRIC E



- 1. Place one square of FABRIC C and one square of FABRIC E right sides together.
- 2. Draw a diagonal line across one square and sew a quarter inch on either side of the line.
- 3. Cut along the line. This will yield two half square triangles.
- 4. Press towards the darker fabric.

Repeat with remaining pieces. This will yield 16 HST's.

BLOCK SEVEN - 12 HST's

USE:

- 6 squares of FABRIC D
- 6 squares of FABRIC F



- 1. Place one square of FABRIC D and one square of FABRIC F right sides together.
- 2. Draw a diagonal line across one square and sew a quarter inch on either side of the line.
- 3. Cut along the line. This will yield two half square triangles.
- 4. Press towards the darker fabric.

Repeat with remaining pieces. This will yield 12 HST's.

BLOCK EIGHT - 8 HST's

USE:

- 4 squares of FABRIC D
- 4 squares of FABRIC E



- 1. Place one square of FABRIC D and one square of FABRIC E right sides together.
- 2. Draw a diagonal line across one square and sew a quarter inch on either side of the line.
- 3. Cut along the line. This will yield two half square triangles.
- 4. Press towards the darker fabric.

Repeat with remaining pieces. This will yield 8 HST's.


ASSEMBLE THE QUILT

Now we're ready to assemble the quilt! Before you start sewing the blocks together, you might want to double-check their size and trim if needed.

NOTE: Our blocks measured **10" × 10" (unfinished)**, they were pretty consistent so we didn't trim them. Our quilt measures **96" × 96"**.

- If you **trim the blocks to 9³/4" × 9³/4" (unfinished)** your quilt will measure **93.5" × 93.5"**.
- If you trim the blocks to 9½" × 9½" (unfinished) your quilt will measure 91" × 91".

Arrange the blocks as shown in the image below.



- 1. Sew the blocks together into rows.
- 2. Press the seams to the right in the first row and to the left in the second row. Alternate like this for the remaining rows.
- 3. Sew the rows together to complete the quilt top.
- 4. Add borders if you wish.

5. Quilt and bind to finish.
