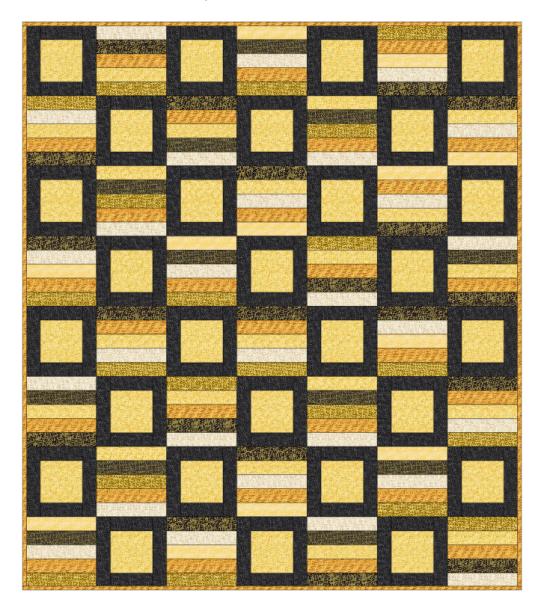
Strip Box Shuffle Quilt

Finished Size: 61 1/4" × 70"

Skill Level: Beginner Friendly

WOF = width of fabric

Use a 1/4" seam allowance.

Fabric Requirements

- **Block A** 7 assorted fabrics ½ yd each (2 ½ yds total)
- Block B -Yellow fabric ¾ yd
- Block B Black fabric 1 ½ yds
- **Binding** ½ yd
- Backing (42" wide) 4 ½ yds (based on 4" overage on all sides)
- Batting Twin size (at least 69" × 78")

Cutting Instructions

Block A

From each of the 7 assorted fabrics:

Cut 5 strips, 2 ¼" × WOF.

Block B

From black fabric:

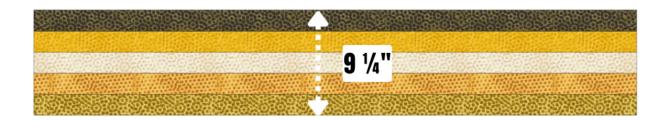
- Cut 14 strips, 2 ¼" × WOF.
 - Sub-cut each strip into four rectangles, 2 ¼" x 9 ¼".
 - Total: 56 rectangles.
- Cut 8 strips, 2 1/4" × WOF (Do not sub-cut these strips)

From yellow fabric:

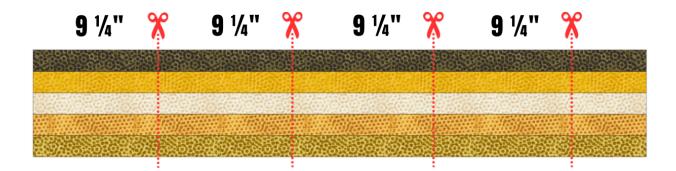
Cut 4 strips, 5 ¾" × WOF.

Block A Construction

- 1. **Randomly** arrange the 2 ¼" assorted fabric strips into sets of 5.
 - This will create 7 strip sets each with five random strips.
- 2. Sew each of the **7 strip sets** together along the long edge with a ¼" seam allowance.
 - Once sewn, each strip set should measure 9 1/4" wide.
 - Press seams to one side.

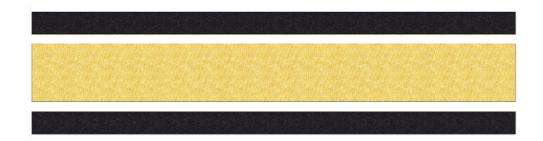


- 3. Sub-cut each of the 7 strip sets into 4 blocks that measure 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ " × 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ ".
 - Total: 28 Block A units.

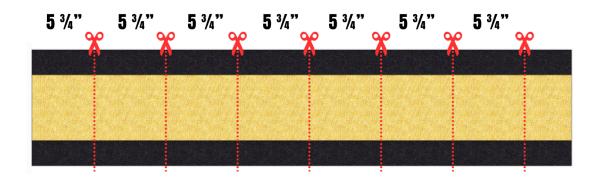


Block B Construction

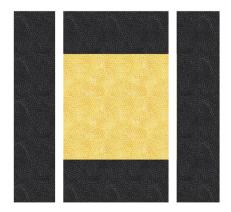
- 1. Sew a black strip (2 1/4" x WOF) to either side of the yellow strip (5 3/4" x WOF).
 - Press seams toward the black fabric.
 - Repeat this with the remaining strips for **4 strip sets in total.**



- 2. Sub-cut each strip set into 7 pieces each measuring 5 ¾" wide.
 - ∘ Total: **28 pieces**



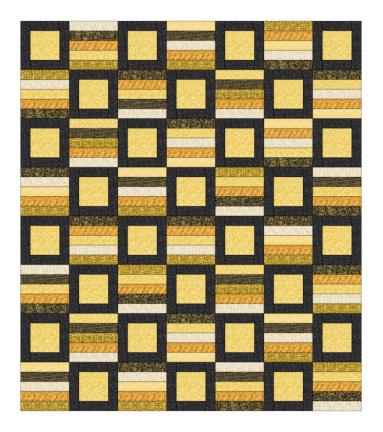
- 3. Take the 28 pieces from the previous step and sew 1 black rectangle (2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " \times 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ ") to each side.
 - Press seams toward the black.
 - Total: 28 Block B units.

Quilt Top Assembly

- 1. Lay out the quilt with 8 rows of 7 blocks each (56 blocks total).
 - Alternate Block A and Block B in a checkerboard layout.
 - Example: Row 1 starts with Block B, Row 2 starts with Block A, and repeat.
- 2. Sew blocks into rows, pressing seams in alternating directions for each row.
- 3. Sew rows together to complete quilt top.



Finishing

- 1. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing.
- 2. Quilt as desired.
- 3. Bind using your preferred method.
