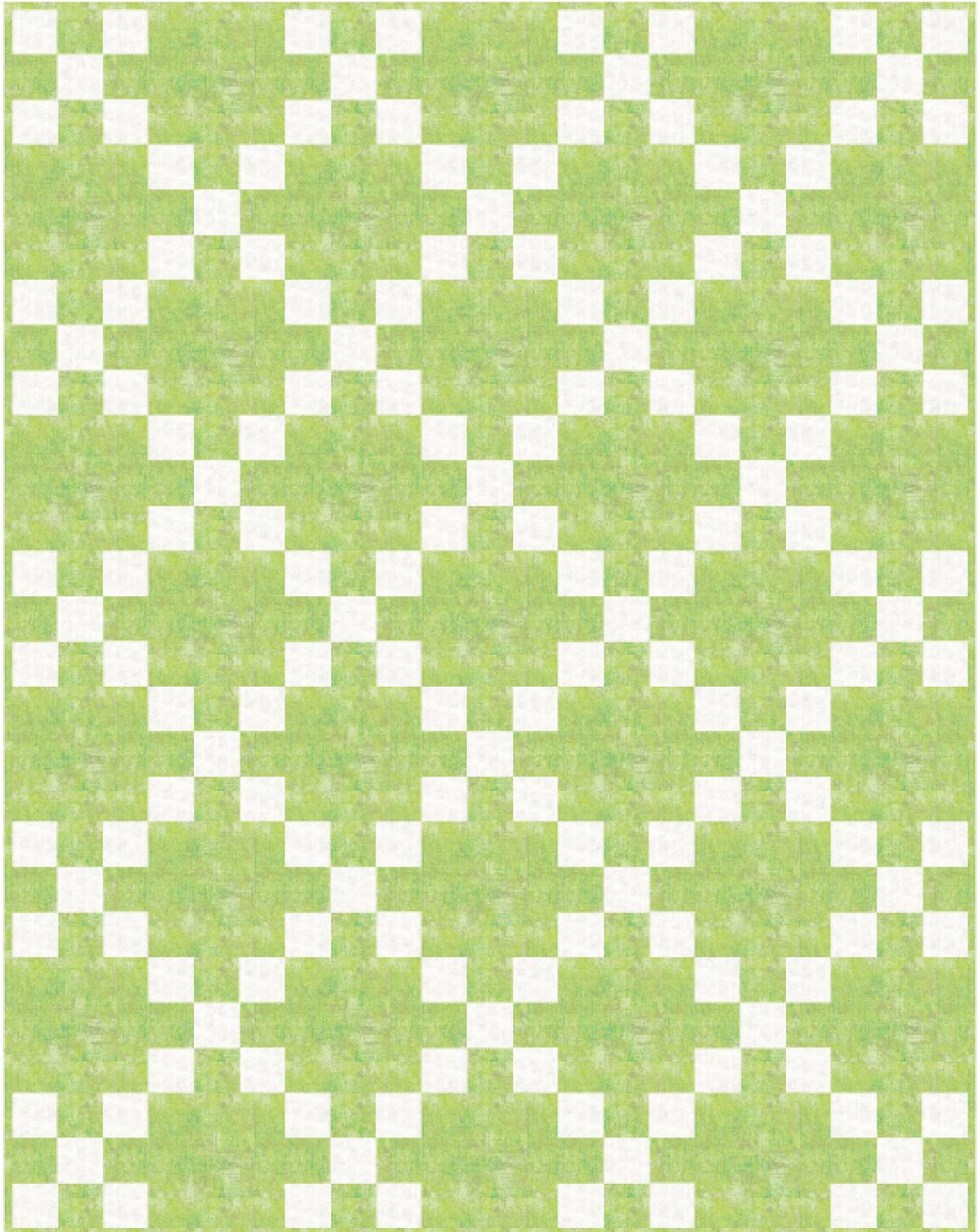


Irish Chain Quilt Pattern

Finished Quilt Size: 63" x 81"

Fabric Requirements

Fabric A: White - 1½ yards

Fabric B: Green - 3 ⅜ yards

Backing Fabric - 5 yards (based on 42" width of fabric)

Batting - 71" x 89" (assuming 4" overage)

Binding Fabric - ⅝ yard

Cutting Instructions

Fabric A: White

- Cut 15 strips @ 3 ½" x WOF

Fabric B: Green

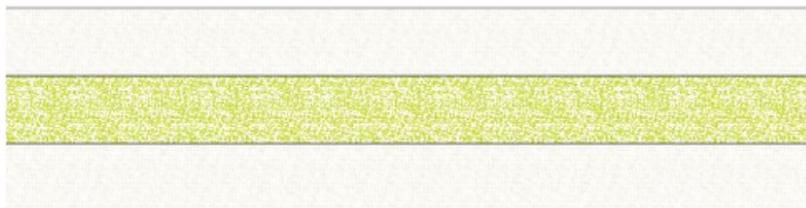
- Cut 8 strips @ 9 ½" x WOF
 - Sub-cut into 9 ½" squares (31 squares)
- Cut 12 strips @ 3 ½" x WOF

Step 1

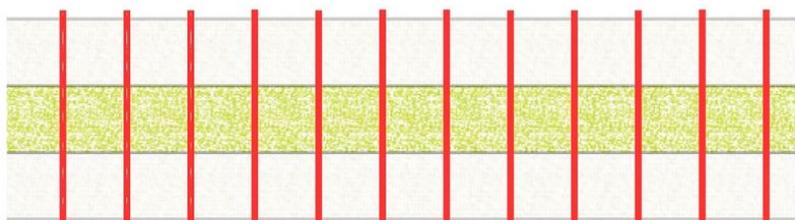
Sew together a strip of Fabric B between two strips of Fabric A to form a strip-set.

Repeat for a total of **6 strip-sets**.

Press seams towards dark fabric.



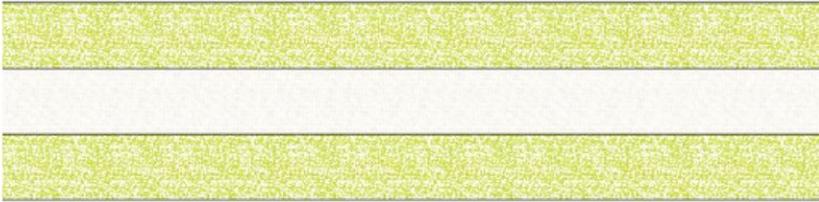
Sub-cut into 3 ½" units for a total of **64 units**.



Step 2

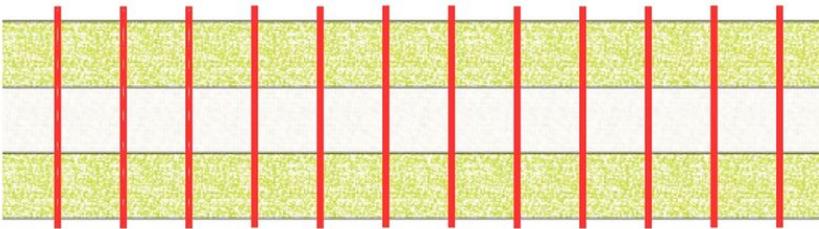
Sew together a strip of Fabric A between two strips of Fabric B to form a strip-set.

Repeat for a total of **3 strip-sets**.



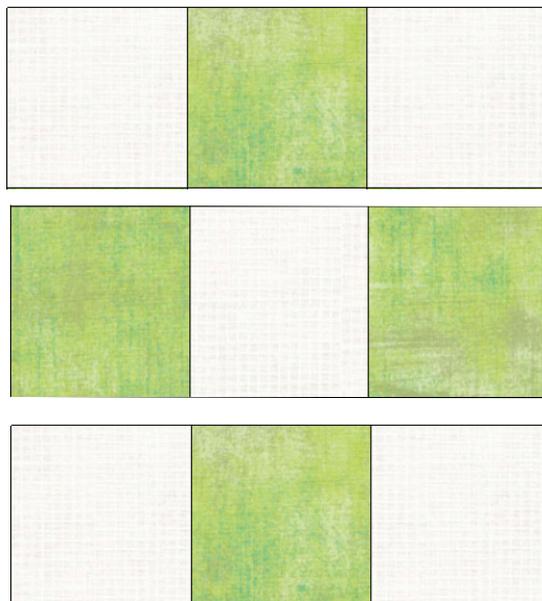
Press seams towards dark fabric.

Sub-cut into 3 1/2" units for a total of **32 units**.



Step 3

Sew pieces together as shown to form a nine patch block for a total of 32 blocks.



Step 4

Layout your quilt as shown and sew together into rows.

Press the seams in alternating directions for each row - to the right for the first row, to the left for the second row and so on.

Step 5

Sew the rows together to form the quilt top.

Add batting and backing and quilt and bind to complete.
